



RSC Conflict of Interest Policy

Council members, directors, officers, volunteers, Fellows, RSC College Members and employees of the Royal Society of Canada (RSC) agree to:

- Act in accordance with the RSC's mission. "To serve Canada and Canadians by recognizing Canada's leading intellectuals, scholars, researchers and artists and by mobilizing them in open discussion and debate, to advance knowledge, encourage integrated interdisciplinary understandings and address issues that are critical to Canada and Canadians."
- Act in the best interests of the RSC.
- Serve the RSC with fairness and integrity.
- Avoid conflict of interest and the appearance of conflict of interest.

A conflict of interest exists:

- When a person related to the RSC, or one of his/her close relatives, has a personal interest in an issue, matter or transaction in which the RSC has an interest; or
- When a person or a close relative act as an agent, representative or spokesperson for any person, business, or organization, in order to influence the RSC on any issue, matter or transaction.
